Future Conventions

As you will be aware the EAC Board made the decision to move to a new guest host nation every third year, returning to Belgium each 1st and 2nd year. After a vote from the delegates present in 2016, the decision was made to remain in Malta for a 2nd term. After successful negotiations between the Chairman and the Astrid hotel in Antwerp, the EAC Convention in

2018 will return the City of Diamonds. 2019 sees us in the 'third' year and after a successful plan and bid from Board member Manolis Karahalios and the team behind Athens Flying Week, we will move to Athens in 2019. As soon as more details are confirmed and dates known we will release further information. Although it is some-

way into the future, we look forward to suggestions and approaches for 2022! 2018 will also see the IMASC conference join us, bringing together the European Air Arms meeting, where military participation is decided.











Convention Bookings

All the information you need is now on the updated EAC Website. This year we have been unable to provide a joint booking system, therefore accommodation and Convention Bookings need to be done separately. Airport Transfers

We have changed the system by which we are providing the airport and hotel transfers to simplify it for all. The Hotel will be handling all transfers on behalf of the EAC. When you book your accommodation please ensure you add your flight details to ensure there is someone there to meet you. This service, should you wish to use it will be ≤ 10 . The transfer to the hotel is approximately 40 minutes dependent on traffic.



We are pleased once again that the hotel are able to offer us their all inclusive Package, which means that once you have arrived, you don't need to spend anything in the hotel. All your meals and snacks are free from any of the 8 restaurants in the hotel. ICAS Participation

We are pleased to be able to welcome John Cudahy, President of ICAS to return to the EAC Convention. John will be present for the duration of the convention and will present on current US regulation and changes. He will also cover the topic of 'Energy Towards the Crowd', which was mentioned in the September Newsletter and is a major talking point in North American airshows.

Capturing the Youth of Today for Tomorrows Benefit.

Air Commodore Dawn McCafferty is the head of the UK's RAF Air Cadet Organisation.
